## MSCC, ANC Combining Workforce Training Efforts

Arkansas Northeastern College and Mid-South Community College, members of the Arkansas Delta Training and Educational Consortium (ADTEC), have agreed to combine their resources in an effort to expand and enhance the customized workforce training services for the college's combined service regions. The institutions will operate this service resource under the name of ADTEC Solutions Group.

The ADTEC Solutions Group will employ faculty with a background in the industrial environment. These faculty members will be tasked with the responsibility of providing customized training for the businesses and industries of the region.

Arkansas Northeastern College (ANC) originally formed The Solutions Group in 1996 as a model for providing training to area industries by designing customer-driven training solutions, customized in terms of content, delivery schedule, and delivery location. Since 1996, The Solutions Group has trained over 12,000 persons, providing over 350,000 contact hours of training.

In 2005, The Solutions Group was recognized nationally for innovative excellence with the Bellwether Award, sponsored by the Community Colleges Futures Assembly. Mid-South Community College (MSCC) also has been actively engaged in servicing industrial training needs for many years, bringing their state-of-the-art training facilities and organizational experience with regional economic development to the new ADTEC Solutions Group partnership.

ANC and MSCC are members of ADTEC, along with Arkansas State University at Newport, East Arkansas Community College, and Phillips Community College of the University of Arkansas. In 2009, ADTEC also was honored with the Bellwether Award for regional collaboration.

According to Dr. Robin Myers, President of ANC, "ADTEC Solutions Group represents a natural extension of ADTEC's commitment to enhance regional economic development through collaboration to better assist existing industries in fulfilling their training needs as well as improving our regional ability to attract new industry to the area."
