## MSCC Students Earn Record Number of Foundation Scholarships

Mid-South Community College students received a record number of privately-funded scholarships during the spring 2011 semester, thanks to a growing list of supporters of the MSCC Foundation.

"Since January 2010, we have added eight new scholarships, and that is really exciting," said Patti Coleman, MSCC Director of Advancement. "I continue to be amazed at the generosity of the people in our community, especially during difficult economic times. I appreciate their willingness to invest in our future and know our students are very thankful for the assistance."
