MSCC Program Coordinator Nominated for Educational Innovation Award

Stephanie Eley, Mid-South Community College Program Coordinator for Communications, Reading, Education, and Study/Survival Skills, has been nominated for a Developmental Studies' Innovative Educator of the Month award from Cengage Learning.
