## MSCC Adds One More Day of Summer Registration – Monday, June 4

Mid-South Community College's summer 2012 semester begins on Monday, and anyone interested in pursuing a new career and/or a better life will have one more chance to enroll. A session of late registration has been scheduled for Monday, June 4, 9 a.m.noon and 3-6 p.m., in the Donald W. Reynolds Center on MSCC's South Campus.

Students who enroll on Monday should be prepared to pay for their classes or to set up a payment plan in the Finance Office. In addition to tuition and course fees, students who register on June 4 will be assessed a \$25 late registration fee.

MSCC scheduled nearly 130 academically-challenging and career-building classes and labs for the summer. Students may select from a variety of general and technical education options and can work toward everything from a certificate of proficiency to an associate degree.

The college also provides training that leads to professional licensures and certifications, and thanks to cooperative agreements with regional universities, Mid-South offers four-year degree opportunities as well through its University Center on the South Campus.

Bachelor's degrees are available through Arkansas State University, Arkansas Tech University, the University of Arkansas at Fort Smith, the University of Arkansas at Fayetteville, the University of Central Arkansas, Bethel University, Montana State University-Northern, and Franklin University (online).

In addition, MSCC students interesting in continuing their education at the University of Memphis or Victory University (Memphis) can benefit from transfer agreements between those institutions. Traditional courses during the summer term will generally meet Monday-Thursday, and no classes will be held on Friday, assuring that all students will have a series of three-day weekends. Evening classes will generally meet Mondays and Wednesdays or Tuesdays and Thursdays.

The college will be closed on Fridays through July 27.

Although MSCC is growing rapidly, students continue to receive individual attention in small classes. Mid-South remains dedicated to student success and goal achievement, and the college's mission is to help people transform their lives through education.
